Duration: 8 weeks, July 4 to August 25, 2023

Hours: Monday to Friday from 8:30am - 4:30pm

Salary: \$16.55/hour

Purpose of Position:

Looking for highly-motivated, team orientated youth (16-18) interested in gaining hands-on work experience, education, cultural knowledge and training. You would spend the summer outdoors working on natural resource management, stewardship and local community projects in and around the Kenora District. Four (4) Stewardship Youth Rangers (SYRs) will work in a team under the direction of a Team Lead and Assistant Team Lead. SYRs should be able to report to Natural Resources & Forestry office at 808 Robertson St, Kenora, ON P9N 1X9 daily and be able to work outdoors performing physical tasks in various terrain and in a variety of weather conditions.

As a Ranger you:

- Get hands-on work experience, education and training
- Develop personal and professional skills
- Develop career and community networks
- Earn 2 high school co-op credits
- Will work outdoors much of the summer performing physical tasks in various terrain and in a variety of weather conditions

Types of projects could include:

- Creating habitat for species at risk
- Monitoring the health of forests
- Maintaining provincial parks
- Rehabilitating wetlands
- Helping with First Nations community events
- You may get the opportunity to work in backcountry wilderness, which may involve overnight canoe trips to clear portages and maintain campsites.

- You are 16 to 18 years of age as of July 2, 2024

- You hold or can obtain a Pleasure Craft Operator's Card (PCOC)
- You hold or can obtain Ontario Recreational Canoeing and Kayaking Association Certificate (ORCKA)
